(TEMPORARY DIVERSION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC)
MAIN STREET PARISH OF GREETHAM
ORDER 2015**

Rutland County Council District Council ('the Council') has powers under section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') to make traffic regulation orders affecting the adopted highway within the County of Rutland.

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council now proposes to make an order entitled the Rutland County Council District Council (Temporary Diversion of Vehicular Traffic) Main Street Parish of Greetham Order 2015 as the Council are satisfied that traffic on the road should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed on or near the road.

The effect of the order will be that, during the dates and times specified below the 7.5T except for access weight Limit will be suspended on the following streets: Main Street, Thistleton, Market Overton Road, Thistleton, Thistleton Road, Market Overton, Main Street, Market Overton, Cottesmore Road, Market Overton, Market Overton Road, Cottesmore and Ashwell Road Cottesmore; and all vehicles will be prohibited from proceeding along the length of Main Street Greetham between Bridge Lane and Little Lane.

The duration of the Closure shall be as from 22nd June 2015 to 26th June 2015.

The closure will be continuously enforced during the period specified.

Reasonable facilities will be provided to allow access to adjacent premises while the work is being carried out.

The alternative route during the closure will be via: Stretton Road, Greetham, Hooby Lane, Thistleton, New Road, Main Street, Market Overton Road, Thistleton Road, Market Overton, Main Street, Market Overton, Cottesmore Road, Ashwell Road, Main Street Cottesmore, Toll Bar, Greetham Road, Cottesmore, Oakham Road, Greetham and Main Street Greetham with a reciprocal route.
